Introduction from Councillor Tyler and why we have arranged the meeting

Introduction from those present and what community engagement they presently are involved in

Scouts 850 in Lowestoft – 80 in Carlton Colville 6 – 14 – 14-18 Explorer and Young Leader run by the district wanted to expand but refused planning permission had new plans drawn up now which are now community friendly moving outwards not upwards . 2nd Carlton Colville have presence in the parish and are involved in the memorial – have allotment now at Borrow Close – trying to get involved in the church e.g. carol service – scout hut available or smaller groups at certain times

Jeremy Bishop – Armistices day service – social isolation is an issue especially when people move here and loose a partner. Support group for people who were bereaved settled down and now thinking about a second group who are newly bereaved and then integrate them into the original group. Pakefield church jointly running a holiday club. Have the bereavement club in the newsletter. Jeremy to send Carlton Colville School and Catch 22 diaries up to Armistices day

Rusty Harper – Mon – Thurs Pre school mornings and tumble tots Friday – various events like bowls, badminton, problems with rubbish and dog walkers – magazine dog walking footpaths designated play area – talk to Environmental Health at Waveney – community centre to issue litter pickers to Catch 22 to help with talk to Ian about engaging at the community centre hard stand area – look into dog walking signs

J. Denny Catch 22 would like to view scout hall with potential of using afternoons – offered to make cards for social isolation people and maybe visit Carlton Hall

Nina Crisp – preschool 2-4 year olds normally feed into Carlton Colville but do come from Kessingland, communications with Carlton Hall and take children to visit and local businesses

Carlton Colville Primary School have swimming pool and offered to other school April – October, poly tunnel, allotment to Catch 22, nursery numbers have dropped as parents place their children in schools close to their work

Peter Rayson – building Shaw Avenue – not heavily used so available for hire – church community is aging and dwindling and various groups folding - church may cease to be

Suggestion to have a youth council formed from Schools and scout groups with a couple of representatives from each group.
