Updates

Rosedale Surgery including Kirkley Mill

The Covid vaccination programme is well under way and 6500 people have been vaccinated already mostly at Kirkley Mill Tudor Wing and all Care homes have been actioned. There is some IT issues with booking nationally or from the surgery which should be ironed out very soon.

Everitt Academy

Has been open for access to all students since 4th January 2021. 20 out of the roll of 52 are attending and following extensive risk assessments of the site it has been agreed that the maximum number will be 22. Some pupils are engaging at home via online which has been assisted by the government providing 14 digital devices although some students still prefer paper in which case packs have been provided. Lateral flow testing for staff and students is ongoing twice a week. It is hoped to develop the outside space to allow for such qualifications as horticulture and gardening. David Peek allotment chair will try to get volunteers to assist with the activities at the next meeting.

Carlton Colville Community Centre

Still closed to groups just open for the Pre-School which is operating reduced hours Monday to Friday and is open to all on the roll. Some issues with cars congregating on the car park during lockdown the clerk had reported to the police to monitor. Andy thanked Jenny and Craig the ESC Councillors for the grant of £250 for wet weather attire for the children at the nursery to use.

St Peters Church

The carol service on 20th December had gone ahead at the East Anglia Transport Museum with around 40 people attending. Sarah sent her thanks. They are keen to do a joint approach this December but earlier in the month to maybe coincide with their Christmas light switch on. Mike Cadman plays in a brass band and suggested that they could combine to provide the music. The Church was currently closed with the exception of funerals. Sunday services were being held on Zoom.

Carlton Colville Scout Group

Still meeting on Zoom for Cubs and Scouts and the Scouting association are helping to put material together to help facilitate this. Stephen had applied for a Community partnership grant from ESC to purchase some laptops to assist with the meetings for those not able to join unfortunately the grant will not be decided until mid-March.
