Meet your New East Suffolk District Councillors for Carlton Colville (also covering Gisleham & Mutford)




Jenny Ceresa

She donated £2000 for the new play equipment on Nicholas Everitt Park, £3000 for Community Action Suffolk for startup groups and a £3000 donation to Lowestoft in Bloom.







Neighbourhood Plan Update

The Steering group would like to thank everyone who took the time to fill in the community engagement survey, 130 paper copies were received and 131 were completed online the results and comments are now being analysed.

Two new members of the public had come forward to assist with the Plan. The group are now applying for a grant to enable an expert to assist with the next stages of formulating the plan.

One comment which was picked up on so far was about the lack of a Post Office and although this is situated on the Dales development, which is in Carlton Colville Ward boundary, some residents seemed unaware. So just to confirm there is a Post Office at Bains store at Harropdale.



Carlton Marshes Nature Reserve (Suffolk Wildlife Trust)



The area of marshes totalling over 100 acres surrounding the Carlton Marshes Visitor Centre at the end of Burnt Hill Lane forms a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). It reflects all the different habitats found in the Broads in quite a small area. Open water, carr (swamp) woodland, reedbeds, ronds and grazing marshes exist in this unique and fragile wetland system, providing a haven for many wildflowers, plants, birds and insects. Species rich marshes drained by a network of dykes and grazed by cattle in summer give ideal conditions for breeding waders and birds of prey. Reed and sedge beds harbour a variety of nesting warblers and tits. Sprats and Round water (ancient peat diggings) are mini-broads full of aquatic life, but need regular clearance to prevent them silting up. Many young environmentalists visit to study for award schemes.

Suffolk Wildlife Trust (set up in 1961) now manages 65 nature reserves and over 3 heathland sites. Members and staff who run the Carlton Centre work hard to preserve the very important marsh habitats so that their future is safeguarded, and visiting enthusiasts and local people alike will be able to enjoy the special rarities they contain.

Guided walks and special events are held across the season, normally with a modest charge to cover expenses, and are based on the Centre. Adults and children with an interest in natural history are encouraged to become members or help care for and maintain the Carlton Marshes and, if they wish, to visit some of the reserves elsewhere in the country.

Primary School Allotment Update

David Peck and Borrow Close Volunteers.

The allotment at the primary school has been a great success, judging by the amount of pupils taking part. I have been fortunate in having help from 4 Borrow Close allotment tenants and the school and without them we could not have achieved what we have.

As well as some tender vegetables, the pupils sow hardy seeds and once grown, plant them outside or in the tunnel. Thereafter it is their responsibility to tend them by watering and feeding. Prior to any session we decide what is to be done to maintain the crops including: sideshooting intermediate tomatoes, pollinating melons and gathering crops.

Produce taken home by the pupils to date is 50 cucumbers and 22 punnets of strawberries. When the school finished for the summer holidays one of our allotment , volunteers baked cakes with vegetable decorations and presented each pupil that attended sessions with a certificate. We were presented with a lovely thank you card made by the children. The school entered the plot into a local competition and the pupils and staff were required to answer questions about the plot. The results of this will be known in late September.
