Joy as Planning Applications Refused

Following the meeting of Waveney District Council Planning committee in February the proposed development of a 1 bedroom house adjacent to 1 Short Lane was refused. Thank you to all the residents who turned out and supported this and who also stayed on to hear the Church Lane development of 78 houses application be deferred for a site visit. This was subsequently heard again on 13th March and unanimously refused.

The Town Council would again like to extend their thanks to all residents who attended either or both of these meetings and extra thanks goes to those who rallied support and delivered flyers the community spirit really did shine through. This said we now hold our breath as the developer has 6 months to appeal but for now we will rejoice in a victory to the public voice! It is important that we stay focused and continue to stick together on this one we will keep you informed of any developments as soon as we hear anything.

It is important for all residents to understand how tirelessly the Town Council worked on this application to ensure that the right outcome was achieved. The Councillors are not experts in planning but spend numerous hours reading and understanding the National Planning Policy Framework and Local Development Management Policies in order to find comprehensive responses.

Carlton Colville was highlighted and commended at the District Planning committee meeting for their in depth knowledge and understanding of such policies all of which is a credit to the Councillors who get involved with this.



On 28th March the Town Council were issued with the Waveney Local Plan, Final Draft Plan (Regulation 19). This is the final stage before the Council submits the Local Plan to the Secretary of State for the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government for Examination. There is a period of public consultation which runs to 24th May. It is proposed that Carlton Colville will get 900 houses, a two from entry school, a care home facility and shops. The plans are available to view at a drop in at Waveney District Council, Riverside, 4 Canning Road, Lowestoft, NR33 0EQ on Tuesday 1st May 2.00 pm – 8.00 pm. You can view all documents online at at the Waveney District Council Website by searching 'local plan'.

The Town Council will be responding according to the guidelines issued on the 'Soundness' of the plan in the four areas described: Positively Prepared, Justified, Effective and Consistent with national policy. It is important that residents have their say also and you can respond following the links on the Waveney final draft local plan 2018 website please please do this it is so important.

The Town Council is planning an opening event with competitions on Sunday August 12th (more details to follow at a later stage). When complete it will provide a challenging yet sustainable concrete street plaza themed skate park to meet the needs of skate boarders, BMX and scooter riders.

From small beginnings the event has grown and grown to encompass all of the county with a wide variety of imaginative and creative walks. This year also sees the introduction of the first ever Fringe Festival, a series of activities that are designed to get you close to nature in the very heart of Suffolk's countryside.

The Walking Festival explores every corner of Suffolk, revealing hidden secrets and special gems from the impressive estate of Helmingham Park, to scenes that inspired Constable, to a dragon on a hillside! This year you can experience the Dawn Chorus with bird watching experts, identify wild flowers at Sizewell Belts, and listen out for the eerie churring of a Nightjar. Dog Fouling

This issue has reared its ugly head again in Carlton Colville. Areas of particular note are Aveling Way Green space/grass area which seems to be covered which is disappointing as there is two bins available to use.

Please, please dog owners as the Dog Trust suggests: "If you have a garden, train your dog to go there & make sure you clean up straight away. Dispose of poo bags in a dog poop bin or any public litter bin". As well as being filthy, dog mess is also unhygienic and a health hazard which can cause Toxocariasis in humans, a serious illness would could lead to potential blindness.

Dog Fouling is against the law. The Public Space Protection Order makes it illegal to fail to clear up after your dog if it fouls any land that is open to the air and to which the public have access. Inconsiderate dog owners could face a fixed penalty fine of £80 or a fine of up to £1000 if there is a conviction in the Courts.
